

MINUTES

The meeting was called to order at 5:30 p.m.

Selection of Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson

Wagner moved to elect Brad Bark as Chairperson. Harper moved to elect Kim Warren as Vice-Chairperson. Second by Kassel. All ayes; motion carries.

Motion to approve minutes of the June 4, 2014 regular meeting. Moved by Harper. Second by Bark. All ayes; motion carries.

Request – Greenwood Cemetery Steps

Bromwell distributed handouts and gave a brief presentation on Greenwood Cemetery Steps. Carroll stated the group has raised about \$2,500 for the project and has a company who is willing to provide new handrails free of charge. Bark asked if the group has consulted an engineer. Carroll stated they do not have one involved at this point.

Commission Member Kraft motioned to approve the repair/opening of the Cemetery Steps if it is privately funded and an endowment is in place for maintenance and it would meet all current city codes. Motion died for lack of second.

Request – Alexander G. Clark Display

Carroll discussed the Alexander Clark Display and distributed map of where display would be placed. The display will be open to the community October 14th through October 18th.

Commission Member Bark motioned to approve the request as submitted. Seconded by Commission Member Kassel. All ayes; motion carries.

Request – Pickle Ball Courts

Klimes informed the Commission when the new Weed Park tennis courts were built there was a request to paint pickle ball lines on them. Through the Tennis Court Construction Project, the request was granted and one pickle ball court was installed. A recent additional request was

made to paint more courts with pickle ball lines. Through the recent Tennis Court Painting Project additional pickle ball lines were painted on the older courts. We now have multiple pickle ball courts painted on the tennis courts in Weed Park that are non-intrusive to the tennis players and can be enjoyed by the pickle ball players.

Presentation – Bill Pearse, Golf Professional

The new Golf Professional, Bill Pearse, introduced himself to the Commission.
