
Muscatine Police Department's K9 Jaxx #253 has been awarded a bullet and stab protective vest.

Muscatine Police Department's K9 Jaxx has been awarded a ballistic vest thanks to a non-profit organization known as The Mona Pants Foundation. The Mona Pants Foundation is a 501 (c) (3) charity and raises money to help rescue groups with medical costs as well as purchase ballistic vests for K9 Officers nationwide.

K-9 Jaxx is a Male, German Shepherd, from Slovakia. Jaxx and Officer Rink, were selected to attend the Dual-Purpose Narcotic Detector Dog, 6-week class hosted by Vohne Liche Kennels in July 2015. The training consisted of narcotic detection training, tracking, and apprehension. Detection was focused on Marijuana, Methamphetamine, Heroin, Cocaine, and Crack Cocaine. Apprehension focused on building searches, open area searches and the tracking of suspects

Jaxx and Officer Rink obtained certification through American Working Dog, a nationally recognized training curriculum. They began working uniform patrol in August 2015. The K-9 team is currently assigned to 2nd Shift Patrol, which works from 1500 hours to 0100 hours. The department provides the K-9 team continued monthly training. These training sessions are designed to ensure both the dog and the handler stay sharp with their skills.

The Muscatine Police Department remains committed to the continued success of its K-9 Unit program. The Department greatly appreciates the efforts put forward by The Mona Pants Foundation to secure funding for Jaxx's vest to provide safety and protection for K9 Jaxx. The Muscatine Police Department would also like to recognize several members of the community who reached out to the Mona Pants Foundation and made a monetary donation towards the cost of the ballistic vest.
