MINUTES

1. Call to Order/Roll Call

Meeting called to order at 5:05 p.m.

3. ALP Update

Gobin updated members on the wrap up of the ALP project. Final plans were submitted June 15, 2018 and feedback will be received within 45 days. Expansion/updates to the project may be required if a port is installed in Muscatine but that may be 10 years out. Members requested for staff to supply a copy of the final plan document and for the engineers to be present at next meeting to discuss the plans.

4. Taxiway Maintenance

The commission discussed the issue of the vegetation growing through the cracks on the taxiway and the ramp between the hangars. Gobin will have Parks and Recreation spray the vegetation with weed killer. Sealing the cracks was discussed but the FAA previously would not fund it but a new fund is starting up specifically for smaller airports which the staff is attempting to obtain a portion of that.

5. New Hangar Development

Gobin updated the commission on the hangar project and its status. Project is currently in the engineering process for design and developing bid specifications for both hangar apron and building for approval by the City Council on August 2, 2018. Financing for the hangars will be a combination of private, state, and city funds.

6. Comments from media or public

Mike Woerly updated the commission with other issues pertaining to the airport including issues with the regulators for both taxiways, gate malfunctioning due to lightening, and peeling hangar paint. Mohammad Pasha did suggest looking into rubberized paint for the hangar while Gobin mentioned pursuing Sherwin Williams for the faulty paint because it is still within the statute of limitations.
