RE: Archaeological Monitoring for the Mississippi Drive Corridor Reconstruction Project, City of Muscatine, Muscatine County, Iowa for Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) Stipulations

Beginning in 2008 your office, our office, FHWA and the city of Muscatine have been consulting on this project and a MOA was signed into effect in 2015. In March of 2018, the intersections of Carver Corner (Hershey Ave. at Green St.) and 2nd Street and Mulberry have been removed as part of this federal action reducing the project limits of this project. The Carver Corner (Hershey Ave. at Green St.) and 2nd Street and Mulberry Intersections will be pursued by the city of Muscatine as a separate project (See attached figures).

Attached is the *Archaeological Monitoring for the Mississippi Drive Corridor Reconstruction Project, City of Muscatine, Muscatine County, Iowa* by Tallgrass Archaeology L.L.C. (TA). This report presents the results of the archaeological monitoring to meet the requirements of the MOA for the section of Mississippi Drive from just west of Elm Street to east of Oak Street on 2nd Avenue. The attached TA report summarizes the monitoring completed to ensure that previously identified sites 13MC323, 13MC324 and 13MC349 were not adversely effected by the reconstruction project. Our office agrees with the summary and recommendations made in the TA report.

13MC323 and 13MC349

No evidence of 13MC323 and 13MC349 were encountered within the project area, with the previously identified area of 13MC323 largely avoided and the reported location of 13MC349 was found to have been completely disturbed by previous extensive and deep utility line and manhole excavations. The TA report notes that any archaeological evidence of 13MC349 is no longer extant and 13MC323 remains for future investigation to determine if significant archaeological deposits are present or not.

13MC324

The only evidence of 13MC324 encountered were two brick conveyor boxes with metal augers on the interior that were known from the 1899-1912 Sanborn maps as having been associated with the oat meal/cereal business. The primary identified potential significance of site 13MC324 had been the presence of a native soil that could potentially contain cultural evidence of the early occupation of Muscatine. This buried soil was not encountered during the current construction project except in wall profile exposures cut by previous utility trenches. No artifacts or features were observed in those profile exposures. Therefore, there remains some

potential for intact portions of this 1830s surface to still be within the south lane of E. Mississippi Drive within those areas of site 13MC324 that were not excavated during the current construction project.

Papoose Creek Sewer

The proposed construction around the Papoose Creek Sewer did not occur until 2018 and it was originally planned that TA would be monitoring excavation activities within 50 feet of that historic sewer line. However, the construction plans were modified so that there was no below-roadbed excavation within 50 feet of that historic sewer line; therefore, no further monitoring was required. As a result, there was a delay in the archaeological monitoring final report because of the anticipated need for additional monitoring that was subsequently not needed.

13MC360

A variety of underground utility lines were encountered in the project corridor, most notable of these was a substantial limestone block wall that was built at the railroad crossing of Iowa Avenue and E. Mississippi Drive. It was recorded as 13MC360 and remains in place.

13MC297

Site 13MC297, which was not included within the current Mississippi Drive reconstruction area and will be monitored per the stipulations at such time that the E. Mississippi Drive segment is constructed.




