Report

1. Recycling: Allied Waste reported that 94.61 tons was recycled for the month of May (April 91 tons).
2. ATE: The southbound camera system at Park & Washington is scheduled to be replaced this coming week to eliminate intermittent flash issues. The 2 intersection approaches at Park & Washington are scheduled to move from 30-day warning period to real citations on June 20.
3. Hershey: We are still being held up by Qwest on the vault reconstruction at the bend on West 3rd, below Green Street. Langman continues on West 3rd Street, east (up) from Green Street. They have the first run of sanitary sewer in place, to the Manhole near 923 West 3rd. They are finished in the intersection of Green and 3rd. Heuer and Langman will be paving the intersection soon. For the next week or so, however, the Green/3rd intersection will remain closed. Also West 3rd is still closed from Main to Cherry (local traffic only). Langman also has a crew preparing driveways and the alley entrance on West 3rd from Main to Green. Last Friday Langman found the blockage in the sewer service connection at TNT (905 Mississippi Drive). They made a new connection to the sewer and Heuer paved Mississippi Drive with M4 concrete mix over the weekend. It was opened to normal traffic use this morning. Ilowa began asphalt overlay this morning on Elm Street. They had a problem with the burner on their new asphalt plant, and only got one lift placed on one lane. They used the balance of what they produced on Little Busch. This will allow a local contractor to get concrete trucks up on Elm Street later this week, without driving on the new asphalt. We are continuing to work with residents to provide access on West 3rd. Langman and I have on-going conversations with them; and the Meltzers were shuttled to their car for an appointment this morning. Denny Kistenmacher, City Project Manager, June 13, 2011.
