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City Administrator Report to Mayor & City Council

REPORT:

1. MFPSI: The MFPSI Board discussed reducing the expected 30.12% municipal share to 20.20% at their January 10, 2013 board meeting. Unfortunately, no adjustment was made. As we learn more, we will keep the Council informed.
2. ATE: We received a payment last week from GATSO in the amount of \$36,205. Net of the GATSO fee, City revenue is \$23,812. The updated summary spreadsheet is attached. Also attached is a 2012 ATE statistical summary.
3. Fire Department Staffing: Effective Monday, January 7th, 2013 Mike Hartman was promoted to the newly created 40-Hour Assistant Fire Chief Position. Please help me in congratulating Mike on his promotion. Chief Ewers plans on having one informal promotional gathering and badge pinning with staff and family members in FD day room once all the promotions are completed.
4. Golf Course: Per Finance Director Nancy Lueck - I've updated the payment schedule for the internal loan on the Golf Fairway Irrigation project (see attached). The total project cost is \$342,800. Based on the budgeted \$50,000 down payment this year, there will be 6+ additional \$50,000 annual payments (through FY 2019) to complete the financing of this project. As with previous internal loans, efforts will be made to retire this debt ahead of schedule if possible.
5. Housing: Please see the attached information on the Section 8 waiting list (reopening).
6. Budget Schedule: Please see the attached revised budget schedule. No change to dates, but we did need to re-order the February 9th session. I have invited Rep. Lofgren and Sen. Brase to the 2/9 session as well.
7. Grant: Muscatine has received notice from Alliant that it will receive two grants as part of the Branching Out tree planting program. Trees Forever will be sending out grant letters next week. Muscatine received grants for shade trees at Riverside Park for an Earth Day project (\$1420) and a grant for street trees in the downtown (\$4,250).
8. Highway 38/61 Connector: Attached is a copy of the powerpoint presentation reviewed by Troy Culver from Snyder and Associates during the 1/10/2013 In-Depth session.

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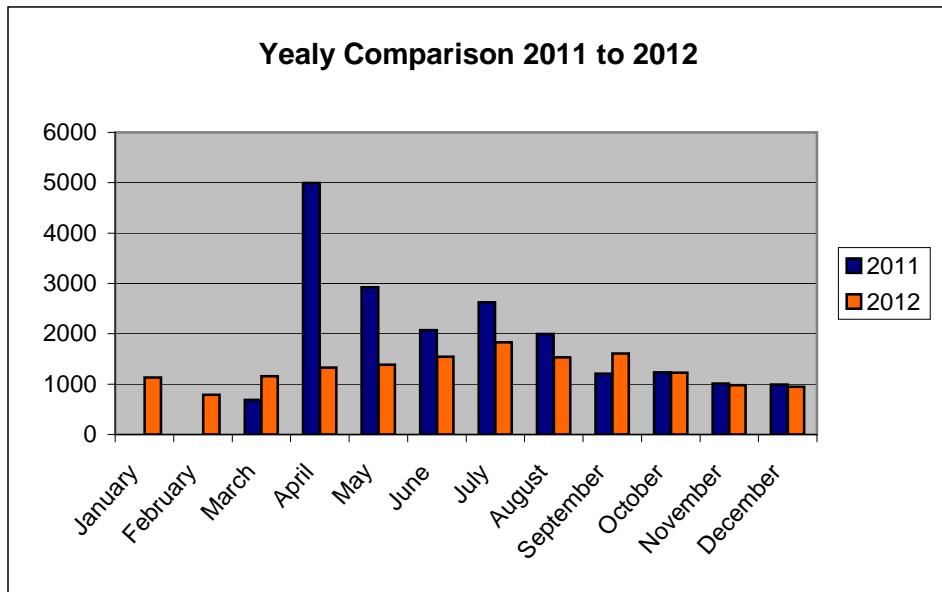

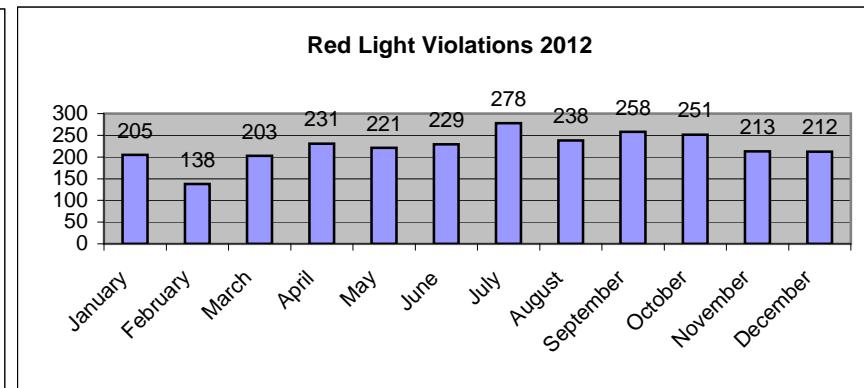
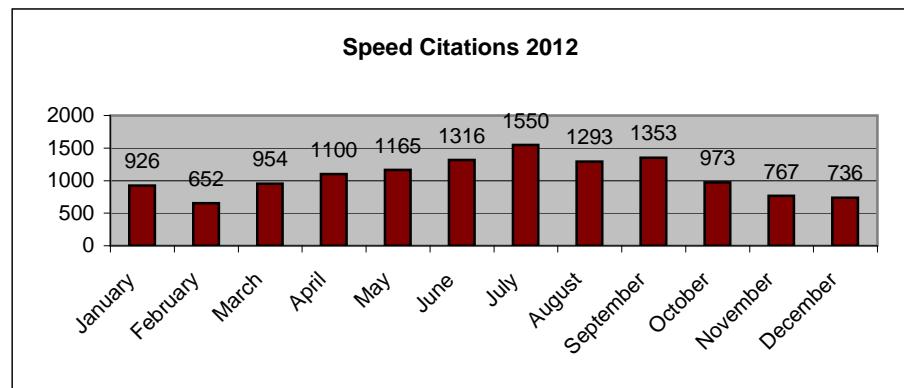

The Automated Traffic Enforcement program became operational in March 11, 2011. The data in the table to the right reflects the same time frames for the last three years for comparison purposes. 2010 is used for the year prior to the implementation of the ATE program. There has been a 30% reduction in crashes at ATE intersections since the program became operational.

Are the traffic cameras having any effect on the driving habits of area drivers?

Looking at the decline in traffic accidents at these intersections as well as a decline in violations tends to make one believe they have. The numbers of citations per month have generally been declining and have started to level off as drivers have adjusted their driving habits. In 2011 there were 19,748 ATE citations issued. That number fell to 15,462 issued citations in 2012. Remember though that the program was operational for 10 months in 2011. For an accurate comparison though, we need to look at the same 10 months in each year. In March-December 2011 there were 19,748 citations issued. During that same time frame in 2012, there were 13,541 ATE citations issued. That is a 32% decline in violations.

Additionally, there has been a 30% decline in motor vehicle crashes at these intersections. In 2010 there were 30 crashes. In 2011 and 2012 there have been 21 motor vehicle crashes during the same time frame.

The department is able to use the Automated Traffic Enforcement equipment for locating vehicles that may be involved in Amber Alerts and other crimes that have recently occurred.

The use of ATE technology has been used by officers and prosecutors as evidence in citing and prosecuting drivers involved in traffic crashes at or near the intersections.

The use of technology in law enforcement and detection allows the department to allocated officers to other intersections and areas of town for traffic enforcement in attempts to make the city and surrounding areas safer.

waiting list

The Section 8 waiting list will reopen at 8 a.m. January 28, 2013 and will close again at 5 p.m. on February 8, 2013.

The waiting list will be open for the following categories of families:

Income-qualified families being displaced as a result of a property being substandard not as a result of actions or inactions by the present occupants of the property.

Income-qualified families displaced by government action or whose dwelling has been extensively damaged or destroyed as a result of a disaster declared or otherwise formally recognized pursuant to federal disaster relief laws.

Income-qualified families with children under the age of 18 or elderly or disabled families who are residents (have a legal domicile) anywhere within Muscatine County; or applicants who are working or who have been notified that they are hired to work within Muscatine County. Applicants will also be given the benefit of the working family preference if the head and spouse or sole member is age 62 or older, or is a person with disabilities. 24CFR982.207(b)(1).

Applicant household incomes must be at or below 30% of the Median Income for Muscatine County, as shown below:

One person	= \$13,750	Four people = \$19,600
Two people	= \$15,700	Five people = \$21,200
Three people	= \$17,650	Six people = \$22,750

Preliminary applications will be available to the public on Monday, January 28, 2013 at the housing department at Muscatine City Hall, 215 Sycamore Street, Muscatine, IA and will be accessible online at <http://www.muscatineiowa.gov>.

All eligible applications submitted between January 28, 2013 and February 8, 2013 will be entered into a computerized lottery to determine the order in which applicants will be placed on the waiting list.

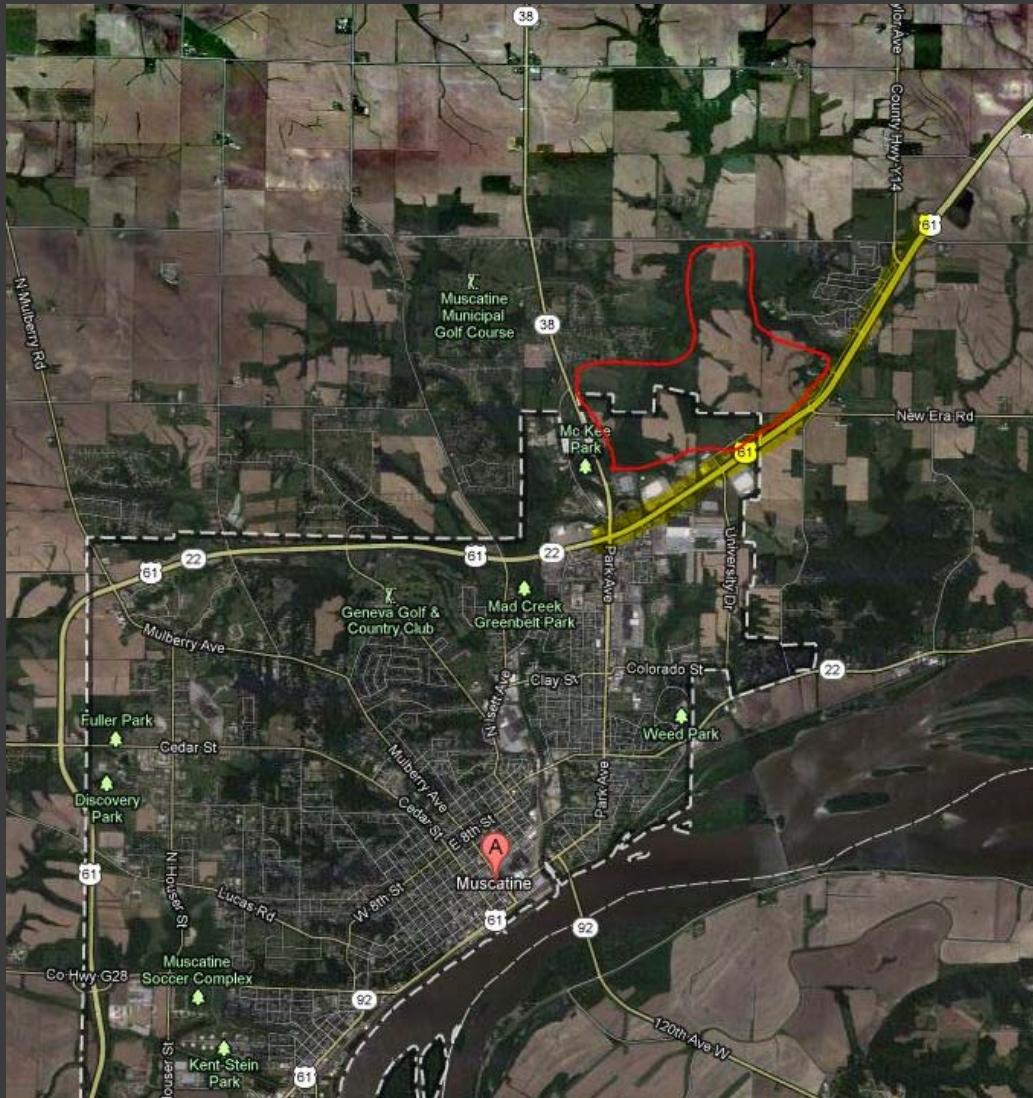

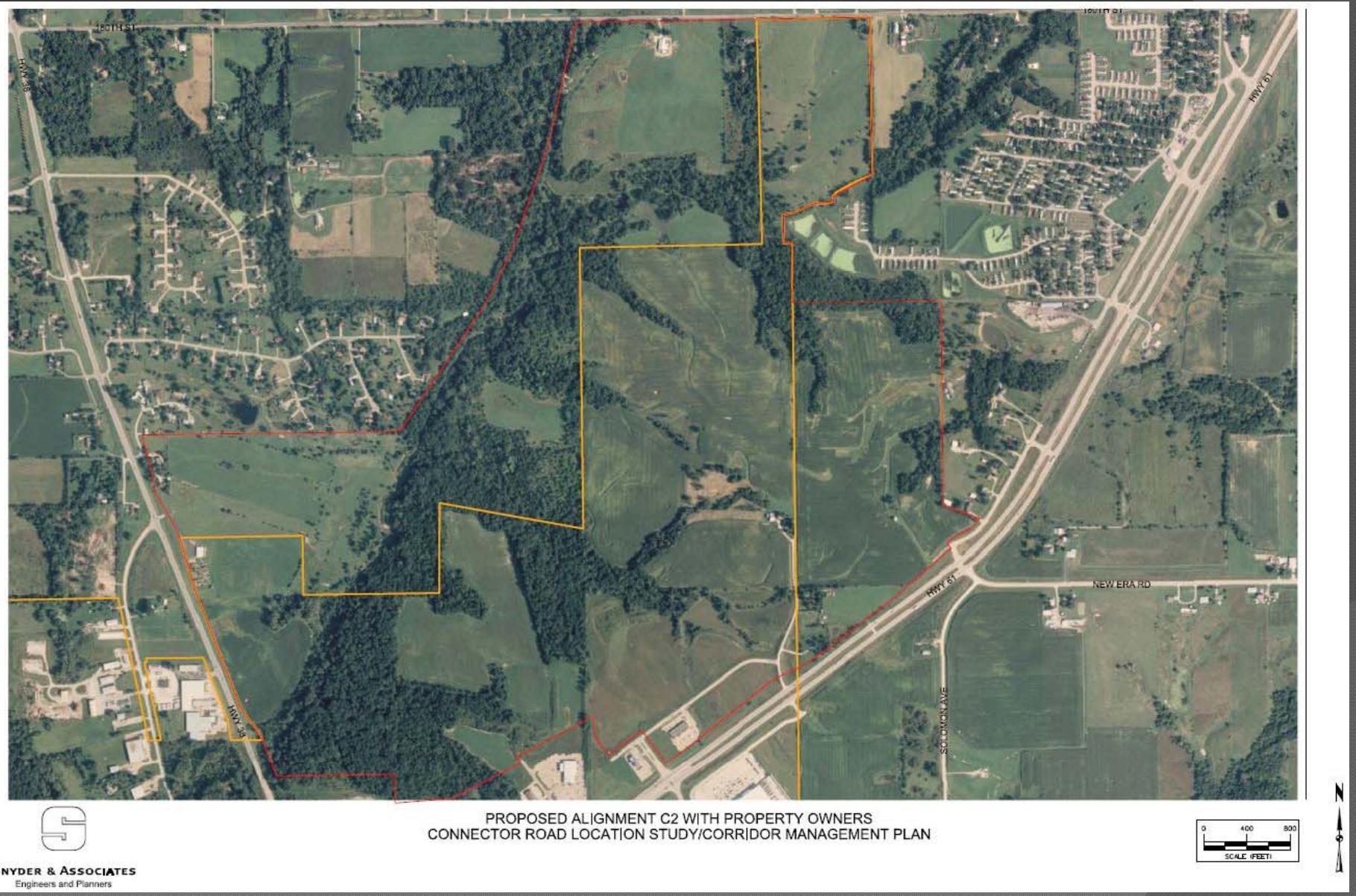
Connector Road – Location/Corridor Study
