Mr. Jameson Zaragoza:

This letter is to inform you that the City of Muscatine received a complaint that you are keeping, sheltering, or harboring a vicious or dangerous animal on the premises in the City in violation of this chapter and that the Muscatine Police Department has performed an investigation into the matter.

On the 9th day of June, 2016 a black and tan male German Shepard dog bit a 54-year-old male on his right arm while picking cherries on his property. The bite occurred in the 100 block of W 9th st. in Muscatine, IA around 10:11 AM. The dog involved goes by the name of "Diesel" and belongs to Mr. Jameson Zaragoza.

On the 9th day of July, 2017 the same black and tan male German Shepard dog bit a 16-year-old female on her left calf while riding her bike on Mulberry Ave. in Muscatine, IA before 7:00 PM. Before the bite occurred, female involved approached a male walking three German Shepard dogs and asked if she could pet them. The dog owner advised "no, one bites", owner proceeded to leave the area, but one dog bit the female before he could walk the dogs away. The dog involved goes by the name of "Diesel" and belongs to Mr. Jameson Zaragoza.

Pursuant to the City of Muscatine Code of Ordinances Chapter 6-8-10 and 6-8-13 (B) you are hereby ordered to have your dog removed from the City of Muscatine. You have three (3) days after receipt of this letter to file an appeal. Failure to file such written notice of appeal shall constitute a waiver of right to appeal the order.

The notice of appeal shall state the grounds for such appeal and shall be delivered personally or by certified mail to the City Clerk.
