### **MUSCATINE CITY HALL OPENS TO THE PUBLIC MONDAY (JUNE 8)**

*Visitors will need to wear masks, adhere to social distancing guidelines*

**MUSCATINE, Iowa** – After nearly two months of being closed to the public, the Muscatine City Hall will open its doors to the public once again at 8 a.m. Monday, June 8. However, there will be certain restrictions that the public will have to follow.

The public entry into the building will remain the main front door with handicap accessibility available on the lower level. Those entering the building will be asked to wear a mask covering their nose and mouth. Walk-in traffic will be limited and the City urges anyone who needs to visit City Hall and speak to a staff person to call ahead and set up an appointment.

Plexiglas barriers have been installed in high traffic areas including Finance, Human Resources, Housing, Community Development, and Parks and Recreation. Signage will also be placed to remind visitors about social distancing, personal hygiene, flow of traffic, and other pertinent information while in City Hall.

Certain restrooms will also be designated for public use.

Hand sanitizer, masks, gloves, and cleaning supplies have been provided to each office for use as needed and staff will be wiping down surfaces after each visitor leaves. Disinfectant wipes have also been placed at the entrances.

High touch areas including door knobs and handrails are cleaned and sanitized daily.

To ensure the public's safety and the safety of staff, masks will also be worn by staff when they are unable to maintain the six feet of distance from the person they are meeting with.

While the building will be open to the public once again, the City Council has determined that they will not meet in Council Chambers and will proceed with virtual meetings for the foreseeable future. The Council will reconsider when to be back in Chambers at its July 2 regular meeting.

The City will also continue to host virtual meetings for boards, commissions, committees, and staff as needed.
