Landline phone outage in Central, Eastern Iowa

Mobile phones not affected by outage, can be used to call 9-1-1 in an emergency

MUSCATINE, Iowa – The Muscatine County Emergency Management Agency was informed today (May 30) of a landline outage affecting most of central and eastern Iowa.

Due to an issue with a service provider, many Muscatine County residents, services, businesses, and emergency services providers are experiencing phone and/or internet issues. 9-1-1 calls from wireless phones are being received at this time. However, landline phones have been impacted and may not be able to complete calls, including to 9-1-1. Due to the nature of the malfunction, services impacted vary between locations.

The Muscatine Emergency Management Agency recommends the following actions at this time:

- If you have an emergency, dial 9-1-1 from a mobile phone.
- If you have an automated alarm system, dial 9-1-1 from a mobile phone to report the alarm.
- Follow local media and official social media pages for updates on impacted or restored services. The outages may vary by location.

There are a few things that people should be aware of in the event of an outage of 911 communications:

- Never call 911 unless you're in a true emergency.
- Tune in to local media, and social media from official sources for additional information and guidance.
- Depending on the nature of the outage there may be alternative ways to reach 911.

When 911 outages occur in our state, responsible parties will conduct a thorough investigation to understand what happened and why it happened so those involved can review if changes are needed to reduce future outages.
