#### DISASTER ANALYSIS GROUP

#### **PURPOSE**

Damage assessment procedures, checklists, and reports are necessary to gather data and evaluate information to determine the extent of damage and the impact on the community resulting from a disaster. An extensive damage assessment is necessary to support requests for recovery programs offered at the state and federal levels. An accurate damage assessment will also support post-disaster mitigation efforts resulting in proposed changes to building codes and land-use regulations which could reduce some of the structural damage from future disasters.

#### **CONCEPT OF OPERATIONS**

Recovery may begin before the event which is causing the disaster is over. A number of activities can be undertaken as soon as practical in order to limit the overall negative effect to the community. One of those activities is in the area of damage assessment. At the time of the disaster declaration and subsequent implementation of this disaster plan, a damage assessment team, or teams, will be created to work in or around the disaster site(s) in order to begin evaluating damages.

The damage assessments may be used for insurance purposes, cost recovery efforts, federal grant programs, and disaster mitigation efforts.

#### **GENERAL ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES**

**Disaster Analyst**. The Disaster Analyst is the coordinator and point of contact between the damage assessment teams and the Policy Group. This person establishes and oversees the analysis process, and assists in preparing and submitting reports for the variety of purposes stated above.

Damage Assessment Teams. The Building Official acts as the Damage Assessment Team Leader, in coordination and collaboration with the Disaster Analyst, Health Inspector and City Engineer on issues related to structures and infrastructure. The primary role of the Building Official includes the assessment of the integrity of structures or infrastructure damaged (if any) in a disaster. Damage assessment survey teams will most likely include the Building Official, the City Engineer, and the Health Inspector, but may include other local government employees. When necessary private sector personnel from the fields of engineering, building trades, property assessment, and other related areas will be used to supplement existing team members. When the need for specialized assistance occurs, such as hazardous materials accident, appropriate personnel will be added to the teams. The emergency mission of the Damage Assessment Team is to:

1. Immediately after or during a disaster to determine the general area or areas which are affected, including assessment of the severity of the situation. Early assessment will be gathered from police, fire, and other units which are in the field.

- 2. When the general area(s) have been outlined, the data shall be further refined and analyzed by field examination. Such field work is to be done by the Damage Assessment Team members.
- 3. The Disaster Analyst will be responsible for gathering and consolidating this information from the team members.
- 4. Keep other public officials advised of the amount and location of damages. Map off the area(s) showing area(s) damaged and the percent of damage within the area(s).

Assessment of a dollar value is to be considered as a secondary function and is to be carried out in a manner which will not interfere with emergency operations.

Assessment of agricultural damages will be accomplished by the County Emergency Board, in coordination with the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service (ASCS).
